When we give the Lord the only chance He will need we will begin to feel the wonderful power and grace of the Holy Spirit and we will begin to feel and see actual changes in our lives. How can I say that? How can I guarantee that if you are walking with the Lord and allowing God to come first in your home you will see and feel changes? But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. (Galatians Chapter 5 verse 22-24 KJV) - when the Holy Spirit is moving in a home you will begin to see joy, peace, longsuffering, and all the wonderful fruits of the Holy Spirit! Have you been seeing those pop-up around your home lately? If not, repent and turn to the Lord fully again in prayer! Put your home in His hands, and continue to desperately search for Him! You will find Him... when you seek Him with all your heart! Amen.

Forgiveness

But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. (Matthew 6:15)

Throughout the Bible we are taught about God's amazing forgiveness. There isn't a greater example of forgiveness than God's. Let's examine it for a moment. We all make mistakes and mess up. When we make mistakes, it is called sin. When we sin, it is a direct violation against the very nature of God. Because sin separates us from God's nature, sin has consequences. It must come from the heart, and it must be given even if they don't deserve it. The bible teaches that if we want God's forgiveness then we must be willing to forgive. Do you trust yourself? Do you know your own abilities? Do you think to yourself "I can do that" or "I can't do that", do you know that you won't fail yourself even when the rest of the world will? Isn't it funny how we can tend to put ourselves on a pedestal and say "we are the standard" knowing full well we are accident prone, failure riddled, and it is only by God's grace that we are successful in anything! As you enter in to day 21 of the 30 day challenge I want to ask you: are your expectations for your spouse more than they should be? Are your "standards" so high that no one could ever hope to meet them? Its humbling to know we serve a God who is so holy, so perfect, so wonderful that it is impossible for us to be in His presence EXCEPT by wearing the grace of Jesus Christ! Have you been loving like Christ? I know I have fallen much short in giving mercy and love to my wife and I have and will continue to repent but the question again remains: are your standards and expectations far beyond what they should be?

Forgiveness is critical and we spent two days understanding we must forgive our spouse and everyone that we love. Knowing that I believe many times in our marriages that many conflicts and arguments would be avoided if we fulfilled the most basic of commands: Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets. (Matthew Chapter 7 verse 12 KJV) - the "golden rule", do to others the things you would want them to do to you... I fall severely short in remembering this most basic commandment but it is critical that we study it, treasure it, put it in our hearts and trust in the Lord to show us how. It is interesting to look at even my own life and know that time and time again I have been so angry and blinded by the flesh that I have totally forgotten to obey the God I serve. Many will teach you, incorrectly, that once you are born again "you can live anyway you want" and I tremble thinking about the judgment for those false teachers. Do you know that scripture plainly says, from the mouth of our Lord Jesus Christ: He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him. (John Chapter 14 verse 21 KJV) - do you love Jesus? Remember as we have discovered: actions speak louder than words...

Its hard, I know its hard, Jesus Christ knows its hard, our Father in heaven knew it would be hard before He created all things. Hard does not mean impossible. We are not perfect men and women and we will fall and fail but we must humbly seek forgiveness and guidance from the Lord. Guidance... giving God the keys to the car and saying "lets go" never thinking to ask "where are we going", trusting in the Lord when His word says: For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. (Jeremiah Chapter 21 verse 11 KJV) — have you found yourself way off course somewhere over in the ditch? That is because you took the keys back from God and started driving your own way... its interesting to see that every time we try to go by ourselves we get lost and make that turn to the desert, it is only when we begin to thirst and hurt that we realize: "uh oh, I think we made a wrong turn", today as you enter in to day 21 of the 30 day challenge I wonder: have you made a wrong turn? Are you trying your way and failing? That should not come as a big surprise to us: Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. (John

Chapter 14 verse 6 KJV). To truly begin to give forgiveness and build trust we must change from the inside out. We must humbly ask our spouse to forgive us, because even if we don't think we are in the wrong, chances are we have equally done wrong. Let us love our spouse and our children not only as Christ loved the church but more so: how we want to be loved. Give them your best, fight the good fight everyday, do not give up hope, know that we will have a break through and treasure it in your heart: even if it takes a lifetime, I will not stop trying to be the person my spouse deserves, the person my Lord Jesus Christ would want me to be. Do all that you do for His glory, to honor His commandments, to demonstrate the fruits of the Spirit in your life, and to show the great love that we are called to show! Love them like Jesus! Amen.

Think to yourself today, what has God done in my life? What has He done in the lives of my family? Praise Him and thank Him for every blessing and every second that He has always been by your side!
