Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses. (1 Timothy Chapter 6 verse 12 KJV)

I am here today to tell you that is only half true, the truth is this: grace and salvation are free through a personal relationship with Christ! Good things are poured out on those who trust for them and our works could never justify us before the Lord, only the blood of Jesus can give us the forgiveness for sins that is required. We sacrifice and put our families first and spend time doing things we don't always like, eating food we don't always want, saying things that don't always come easy, all in the desire to love our families and serve them... as you enter day 19 of the 365 day devotion I'm curious, does our God not deserve even more? The God who sacrifice His only begotten Son

Jesus so that we could have freedom found only in a personal relationship with Christ, does that God not deserve everything? "I'm to tired to go to church" He wasn't to tired to carry the cross! "I don't have the money to pay tithes" and yet you have money to waste on the creature comforts of life? As the Lord who gave everything for us we must fight the good fight, we must struggle against darkness, we must never surrender to the world for we can only surrender to the mercy and grace of Christ!

Today pray the Lord would strengthen you, that He would refresh you, and that He would give you wisdom to fight the good fight. Pray the Lord would open your eyes to the enemies snare, and that He would continue to give you victory through the Lord Jesus.
